- Means of assessment and desired level of student achievement
 Students take a capstone course specific to their media area. The course, ARTS 4923
 Professional Development, expects students to produce a portfolio of their work for exhibition as a final research project along with an artist's statement and professional resume.
 Depending on the media area, a website is also required. These aspects of performance are then evaluated by faculty before students receive a grade and are permitted to proceed to graduation.
- 2. Reporting of results

Reports are generated by the faculty who then pass them along to the chair of the department who then communicates to the dean or they are assessed in the classes through the form of formal critiques, professional portfolios, and professional and public exhibitions.

☐ Results of analysis of assessment of Student Learning Outcome

We polled a sampling of students in the ARTS 4923 Professional Development course from the graphic design, printmaking and photography areas. The graphic design section is a stand-alone course, while the printmaking and photography are combined section classes. These 21 students were reviewed by the three faculty. Students are given a value of 5 (best) through 1 (worst) per each of the four criteria.

1. Develop a general knowledge of art concepts and technical skills

Printmaking: Two 4s

Photography: Two 5s, Three 4s

Graphic Design: Four 5s, Four 4s, Four 3s, One 2, One 1

2. Develop a distinct skill set within their media area

Printmaking: Two 4s

Photography: Three 5s, One 4, One 3

Graphic Design: Three 5s, One 4, Three 3s, Four 2s, Three 1s

3. Understand the history and criticism of visual art and design. (n/a for graphic design)

Printmaking: One 5, One 4

Photography: One 5, One 4, One 3, Two 2s

Graphic Design: n/a. History and criticism are covered in History of Graphic Design rather than

Professional Development for all students focusing on graphic design.

4. Develop and appreciation for contemporary art practices theories and works

Printmaking: One 5, One 3

Photography: Two 5s, Two 3s, One 2

Graphic Design: Three 5s, Eight 3s, One 2, Two 1s

We do not see the need for changes as a result of this assessment plan, though the BA degree is undergoing departmental review and is part of an ongoing accreditation process, both of which will result in changes to the degree. The discontinuation of the ARTS 4923 Professional Development course as part of the BA is probable and being studied by the Art Department's BA committee.

The new BFA in Graphic Design degree will be the only option for graphic design students, which will remove the graphic design area as part of this BA assessment.
