## Next Steps

The Graduate Coordinator is currently undertaking a re-alignment of the M.Ed., Ed.S. and Ph.D. programs in CIED in order to provide a series of graduate education experiences that will appeal to a broader range of working professional educators. The goal of this re-alignment is to attract a

greater number of graduate students to CIED in order to improve course offering efficiency and overall graduate student numbers. As a part of this realignment, course objectives will become the basis upon which the program is evaluated using key assessments in addition to the defense of the culminating project.
