- The Master of Education in Educational Equity was approved at the quarterly meeting of the Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board
- Two successful Board Meetings held. One on campus in Fayetteville and the other at Heifer International in Little Rock, AR
- Academy-Wide Professional Development on Adverse Childhood experiences and Trauma Informed Care
- Teacher Training Institute was help on campus for over 60 teachers representing over 20 districts and 30 schools across the state.
- Adopted Kira Talent as academy's digital admissions solution
- Adopted and implemented Sibme as the academy's online video coaching and collaboration platform
- Increased Partner Districts from 6 to 24 from Cohort 1 to Cohort 3 of the Equity Fellowship
- Brought in a Cohort of 60 Equity Fellows for the second Cohort of the Equity Fellowship,
 a 428% increase from the first Cohort of the Equity Fellowship
- Staff conducted a District Tour and visited 8 partner districts in September 2019
- Received 239 applications for the third Cohort of the Equity Fellowship
