Course Assessment Summary Report COMM 1023: Communication in a Diverse World

The department completed its assessment plan for COMM 1023 during the 2021-2022 academic year. This included six, on-campus, one honors on campus, and two online sections taught by two full-time instructors. A total of 911 students were enrolled in this course during this time period. This is a summary of the section assessments, which are available upon request.

Goals for the Assessment

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, we postponed the procedural goals outlined in the 2021 assessment report. The department will address the following goals during the 2022-2023 academic year: The procedural goals include:

- Current instructors will meet to review and revise course objectives. Instructors will also work to ensure that the pre- and post-test assessments are completed across all on-campus, regularly enrolled sections during the 2022-2023 academic year.
- That staff will also review potential assessment items from course exams, identifying a pool of at least 10 items targeted at each course objective.
- Course objectives will be paired with learning outcomes in the social science core.
- The instructional staff will take steps to address any potential reliability and validity issues with the assessment instruments.

Assessment Procedures

Instructors submitted pre- and post-test assessment results for the 2020-2021 academic year. Those results are included below.

Assessment Results

The average scores showed substantial student achievement from pretest to posttest. Fall, Sec 001, Fall Sec 002, Fall, Sec 005, 006, Spring, Sec 001, Spring, Sec 002, and Spring, Sec 901, 902 used a 10-item assessment. Fall, Sec 004, Fall, Sec 001H, and Spring, Sec 003 used a 14-item assessment:

Summary of Instructors' Comments & Feedback

The instructors reported satisfaction with the overall levels of student achievement. They did not report consistent problems or issues with the assessment procedures or results.

Conclusions

Overall, gains were made in student achievement from pre-test to post-test. However, the Fall 21 online section (905/906) reported a decline in scores from pre-test to post-test for course objective #2. The Spring 22 online section (901/902) reported a decline in scores from pre-test to post-test for course objective #6. The instructor assessed course objective #6 with one-item, which may explain the decline in scores. In the future, the instructor will assess course objectives with a more robust, multiple item assessment to ensure validity. Furthermore, the undergraduate director will work with all instructors of the course to ensure that the same assessment items are used across sections and that data is submitted for both course objectives and social science outcomes in the next academic year.

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
