PROFILE

Kristi Cheramie is Professor and Head of Landscape Architecture at The Ohio State University, where she leads a nationally recognized program of more than 200 students and 18 faculty within the College of Engineering. Since 2020, she has directed sustained program growth, including a 120% increase in enrollment, successful dual accreditation (2023), and the expansion of faculty capacity and student funding pipelines.

Her leadership focuses on advancing design education within a land-grant mission, aligning academic programs, research, and public engagement with regional and national priorities. She has developed interdisciplinary initiatives that connect landscape architecture, architecture, planning, and engineering, and has built partnerships that position design as a critical contributor to environmental, cultural, and community-based challenges

Cheramie brings experience in faculty hiring and promotion, accreditation, curriculum transformation, and advancement strategy, positioning her to lead complex, multi-program design units. A recipient of the Rome Prize and author of *Through Time and the City* (Routledge, 2020), she combines nationally recognized scholarship with a demonstrated record of institutional leadership.
