## Traffic Appeals Court Annual Report—FY 14

The University Traffic Appeals Court met twelve times in FY14: July 25, 2013, September 12, 2014, October 24, 2013, November 21, 2013, December 12, 2013, January 23, 2014, February 20, 2014, March 20, 2014, April 24, 2014, May 22, 2014, and June 26, 2014.

In FY 14, 523 appeals of University traffic and parking violations were filed, which represents a 22% decrease from FY 13 when 674 appeals were filed. However, it still is a 23% increase from FY 12 when 425 appeals were filed. The decline in FY 14 is likely due to the Office of Parking and Transit not offering the option to appeal online. This was temporarily eliminated due to a technical website error—all appellants needed to appeal in person at the Office of Parking and Transit. The office hopes to complete repairs to their website by August, 2014 to restore the ability to appeal online when an increase in appeals will likely be seen again. Of these 523 cases, 39 of them are second appeal (an oral appeal) requested by the appellants, a 22% decrease from FY 13 when 50 appellants requested a second appeal. - New signage in Lot 14B concerning weekend parking
